Located in the beautiful Northwest district of Washington, DC near the National Zoo, the Howard University School of Law can be reached by car, taxi, or metro.

If driving, take Connecticut Avenue to Van Ness Street. Turn east on Van Ness Street, and proceed past apartment buildings on both sides of the street. The school is at the end of the cul de sac on Van Ness. Parking is limited; Metro is recommended.

Via Metro, take the Red Line to the Van Ness/UDC station. Take the Connecticut Avenue exit. Walk left on Connecticut to Van Ness. Turn left on Van Ness and proceed past apartment buildings on both sides of the street. The Law School buildings face a circle at the end of the cul de sac.
